


Happy Anniversary!

Fantastic Frogs

Hope everyone is having a great summer so far. It's hard to believe we are coming to the end of Summer, although it has been fun. We have been spending a lot of time outdoors. The children enjoy having their morning snack and story time by the outdoor sanctuary. We have also enjoyed center activities outside. The children's favorite thing to do is dance around the picnic tables with the colorful scarves as they listen to their favorite songs.

One of the children's favorite highlights for this past month was waving flags as they pretended to march on the Fourth of July Parade. During the week of bugs and insects they eagerly searched for roly polys to put in their bug containers. They learned that a roly poly is not a bug, but a crustaceans which is a member of the shrimp, lobster, and crab family. They also learned that a roly poly has seven plates on their back and when they become frightened they roll up into a tiny ball. Even though a roly poly is not a bug the children had fun learning about them.

For the month of August we have great themes planned. Our themes include "Music Appreciation" (during this week we will learn about different musical notes and make fun instruments out of toilet tubes and paper plates). Other themes include "Amazing Authors", "Baking and Cooking", and "Fun at the Zoo". This month we plan to cook up some simple kid friendly recipes such as a delicious trail mix, bagel pizzas, and sushi roll ups. The children will practice scooping, pouring, spreading and mixing.
