Dear Park's Edge Preschool Families,

On Thursday, January 9, PEP staff were trained in CPR, and the use of our AED machine by Brian Schulenburg from Pulses First Aid Training. The Wisconsin Licensing Department requires all staff to be CPR certified. The training also covered first aid, blood borne pathogens and the Heimlich maneuver.

In January we rang in 2025 with teaching our Dragonflies bout New Year celebrations and how fun and joyful an experience they can be! We learned how some animals hibernate or live in the jungle. Traveled the world through different types of transportation vehicles as well as observed lights and shadows.

In February our themes will be exploring weather, love, kindness and diversity as well as dental hygiene.

By learning to understand the weather this helps us better grasp the environment, prepare for outdoor activities and appreciation and curiosity for nature. During the week of Jesus Loves Me we will be teaching our class about being loving and how learning how to be loving is essential for developing emotional intelligence, nurturing relationships, and fosters empathy. The following week we will be instilling kindness and diversity to the class showing how being kind promotes empathy and compassion despite our differences. Our last theme for February will be about Dentists, which helps us to learn how to take care of ourselves and our health.

In February, the Dragonflies im to enhance fi e motor skills and expand their vocabulary, focusing on topics like animals, colors, and shapes. Fine motor skills, which include small movements of the hands and fi gers like grasping and pinching, are essential for daily activities. Activities this month will include using utensils at mealtime, handling paintbrushes, molding play-dough, and popping bubbles. Th oughout these activities, we will engage in discussions about our observations and actions.

We encourage parents to participate in fi e motor tasks at home as well. Some enjoyable activities to try include coloring, creating necklaces with Cheerios or fruit loops, fi ger painting, doing puzzles, fl pping through books, inserting coins into a piggy bank and even brushing your teeth together!

We were able to ring in the New Year with lots of music and dancing in the classroom, followed by cozy stories about animals winding down for hibernation. Between lessons about hibernating animals and arctic animals, the Frogs class spent the beginning of January going on lots of nature walks, picking up pieces of nature for a collage and keeping our eyes peeled for snowy owls on our owl hunts. The children loved working together on these group activities! Transportation has been a great topic as we've been cooped up from the cold, passing the time with block ramps for our cars, and putting different shapes together to make our own car art, which is on display in our classroom!

February will have lots of exciting lessons, whether we are inside or outside. For Shadows and Light week, the children will be able to crawl through tunnels in the classroom to build their large motor, practice making shadows with flashlights, and learn about Groundhog Day. During this week, we will be looking at the book "Shadows and Reflections", which has photos of people being reflected in a puddle, the shadow of a fence being cast onto a car, and other interesting representations of light and shadows in the world. It will help the children think about how light behaves all around them.

Next it will be Weather week, with games like the snowball toss and the freeze dance, and weather permitting, we will build and fly kites! The Valentine's Day Parade will be part of Jesus Loves Me week, at 10am on February 14th. Kindness and Diversity week will have collaborative tower building and self-portraits, and Healthy Teeth week will include fun activities like the food in teeth collage and play with minty fresh play dough!

We are looking forward to a month of love and kindness in the Frogs classroom. Thanks to all of you, we have a room full of awesome and unique kids, and it is an honor to help them learn and grow here at Park's Edge.


