
We look forward to another fun-filled busy month at Park's Edge Preschool.

## **NAC Nook**

Hello Families!

The NAC Nook is back! In this segment of the newsletter, we will discuss different NAC standards that families have questions about. Our first standard we will discuss is:

C4. Employees communicate with me on an ongoing basis about my child's experiences and activities.

Did you know that the teachers in your child's classroom communicate about your child's day through the ProCare app? They will document when your child ate, slept, was changed (if applicable), and activities that were done that done. Depending on how busy the day is, it might take them until naptime to document this information. The ProCare App is a great way to ask teachers questions, relay information (ex: if your child will be staying home or coming in late a particular day), and communicate with the teachers if drop-off and/pick-up are not the best options for you. Conferences, which are held twice per year, are a great way to meet with your child's teacher. During conferences you will collaborate with the teachers on developmental goals, learn the developmental milestones your child has reached, and get a chance to have some one-on-one time with the teachers. It is a great time to bring up any concerns, proud moments, or questions you have about your child's learning.

We look forward to sharing with you each month different NAC standards and how we at Park's Edge Preschool follow them.

This information will be based on the parent surveys conducted in Fall during the last round of conferences.
