Making stair navigation fun such as singing or counting the stairs as they go up or down while holding the railing or hands fostering safety and adventure!

#### Hello Families,

This month for the NAC Nook segment we will be going over the standard that addresses PEP's use of technology in the classroom. E22. Teachers provide other activities instead of using TV/DVD/video and computers with infants, toddlers, and two-year olds.

Did you know that the upstairs classrooms do not watch videos on IPADS even if they pertain to the theme? This is because according to NAC technology usage is not appropriate in the classroom yet and children that young learn best through play and hands on learning experiences. At home it is the appropriate place for children to learn about technology if the parents choose. The Sunshine classroom does not watch videos as this is still not age appropriate and does not meet our NAC standards. The downstairs classrooms at times use videos for learning if they cannot go outside or the videos pertain to their lessons. This is not an everyday occurrence and at this age children are beginning to learn about technology use in the classroom (though minimal).

In the school age classroom, we limit personal cell phone and IPAD use in Summer. This is because we offer a variety of learning experiences, such as field trips, throughout the Summer. The children use technology in school so get the experience year-round, and at PEP we want children to make friends and participate in the fun activities our teachers have worked so hard to prepare.
