Dear Park's Edge Preschool Families,

Everyone is excited to be able to get outside more often now that the weather is warming up. With the sun staying out later, we are very fortunate to be able to play longer outside in the afternoon.

Every year, each classroom makes adorable Valentine's that we divide among Emanuel Church members, Complete Care Senior Living, and Zablocki VA. We heard back from a recipient of one of the cards who said, "I got your Valentine greeting today and I can't thank you enough. It was so kind, I could cry—but tears of gratitude." It really made all of us realize the importance of connections and community outreach.

Friday, March 7, is Picture Day and our Professional ½ Day. Pictures will be taken from 7–11 a.m. All children who are entering 5K in the fall will be photographed in their cap and gown. If that is not a regular day of attendance, please have your child here at 11:20 a.m. to be photographed individually and for the group photo.

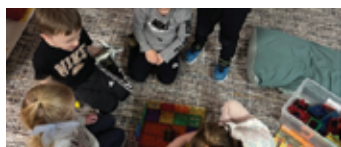

Hello,

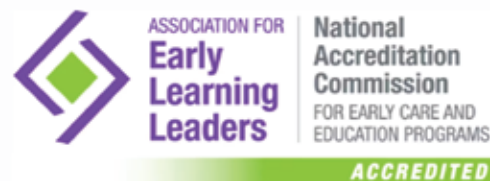
This month for the NAC Nook we will be discussing how we help you understand your child’s development.

C7. The program provides information to help me better understand my child’s development and learning in various ways, such as meetings, workshops, articles, etc.

The biggest way we help assess your child’s learning is through our assessments. The teachers conduct observations and document the different skills your child is learning. They then document each standard and present their assessments to you during conferences. We hold two conferences each year and encourage every parent to sign up. This is the best way to learn about your child’s development and get ideas on ways to support your child’s learning.

There are resources at the front office you can utilize about varying topics such NAC information, health department resources, articles, etc. These relate to children’s development, health, and education. These materials are available any time and we are happy to answer any questions you have.
