We would like to welcome Wyatt, Shea, Eliza, Ember, and Chloe to the class, along with their families. We are so excited to get to know everyone!

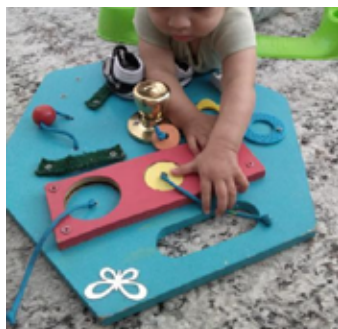

We will be learning about Back to School with our Open House. Please come in and enjoy the activities in all the rooms! We will also be learning about Our Families, Favorite Books, and Apples.

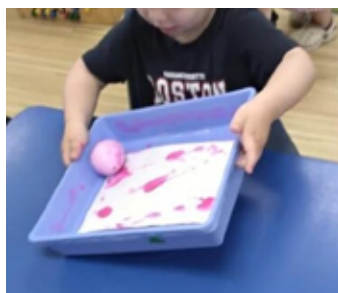
If you haven’t already, please send family photos to Kristin@Parksedgepreschool.com so we can add them to our family tree.

The kids have loved exploring the room in a different way while still having fun learning. It's incredible to see their counting skills strengthen throughout the month!

Just a few friendly reminders: Please check your child's cubby to make sure they have appropriate backup clothes. We are also running low on spare clothing, so please return any clothes your child has borrowed. If you would like to donate any gently used clothing, we would gladly accept it for the classroom.

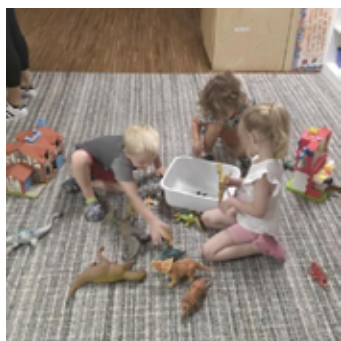

NAC Nook

For this month’s NAC Nook, the standard we will elaborate on is C8: The program provides resources on the importance of health and developmental screenings, as well as available community resources.

At the front office, to the left, there is a Parent Resource Center. There is information about vaccination schedules, safe sleep, Emanuel Church, articles on tummy time, and our accreditation. Articles on various topics related to child development are switched out every 3–4 months. Topics vary from why tummy time is important to how play supports development.

There are also health-related resources and articles from the Hales Corners Health Department available in the Parent Resource Center.

Park’s Edge Preschool collects health reports and immunization records every six months for children under 2 years old. Children ages 2–5 years need an updated health report and immunization records every two years, and children older than 5 years need an updated health report and immunization records every five years. An after-visit summary can be submitted in place of the health report form. Most after-visit summaries include immunization records. This helps ensure that wellness visits are being conducted, and this documentation is required by the Wisconsin Department of Children and Families (DCF).
